CAMP KALAHARI: FACTS & INFORMATION

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UNDERSTATED AND AFFORDABLE, ADVENTUROUS AND FUNKY, CAMP KALAHARI IS SET AMONGST THE WAVING PALMS AND ACACIA TREES ON BROWN HYENA ISLAND IN THE MAKGADIKGADI.

WHERE IS CAMP KALAHARI

20°28'3.59"S 25° 8'0.39"E

You'll find Camp Kalahari amongst the acacias and mokolwane palms of Brown Hyena Island, on the edge of Botswana's hauntingly beautiful Makgadikgadi Salt Pans. Wildlife in the surrounding savannah includes brown hyena, bat-eared foxes, elephant (the camp swimming pool is a welcome stop!), meerkat and during the green season, spectacular numbers of zebra and wildebeest.

WHEN IS A GOOD TIME TO GO

Camp Kalahari is open all year round. Some activities are seasonally dependent, and the timings may vary.

Dry season: May – October

Green season: November – April

HOW DO I GET THERE

Direct flights from Cape Town and Johannesburg to Maun and then take a small charter plane to the Makgadikgadi. Road and self-drive transfers from Maun (approx. 4-5 hrs) are also possible.

WHERE WILL I STAY

12 spacious Meru tents - 6 twins, 4 doubles and 2 family tents (each with 1 king size bed & 2 single beds). All are ensuite with indoor showers, outfitted with standing fans, rich textiles and four poster beds.

WHAT WILL I EAT

Camp Kalahari has a reputation for delicious, fresh and original food. Meals are plated, not buffet style. Please let us know of any dietary requirements prior to arrival.

FULLY INCLUSIVE RATE INCLUDES

Airstrip transfers, all meals, daily activities, local drinks and laundry included. Flights, premium brand beverages, discretionary tips/gratuities, items of a personal nature and personal travel insurance excluded.

WHAT ARE THE FACILITIES

Camp Kalahari is refreshingly simple, cosy, comfortable and traditional. Guests can relax in a traditionally-built thatch library, living and dining area, and when it heats up, cool off in the large swimming pool.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW

- We welcome children of all ages (please refer to our rates for child policies).
- There are lanterns as well as electrical lights in the guest tents and dining area.
- Camera charging facilities are available in the mess tent (please bring an adaptor).
- Wi-Fi is available in camp.
- Our vehicles are open, with rooftop seats, and accommodate a maximum of 7 guests.
- If quad biking, please bring a good pair of sunglasses or goggles - the sunlight and dust can be harsh.



WHAT WILL I DO HERE?

Year Round:

- Meet the habituated meerkats.
- Walks with the Zu/hoasi Bushmen.
- Game drives and night drives.
- Game drives to the Makgadikgadi NP (on request for stays of 4 nights or more).
- Search for the elusive brown hyena.
- Visit the site of Chapman's Baobab.
- Helicopter flips.*
- Morning and afternoon horse rides.*
- Spa treatments - advance notice required*

Dry Season (May - October):

- Lie out on the pans at sunset and watch the planetarium show unfold.
- Quad biking. (2 guests per quad bike, weather dependent).

Green Season (November – April):

- Witness the zebra and wildebeest migration, the second largest in Africa.

**At additional cost.*

Children of all ages may join the bushmen walks.

Children 6 years & older may join quad bike expeditions.

Children under 12 may not drive the quad bike.

Children 8 years & older may do horse riding activities.
